We start in February with a trip to the Russell-Cotes Museum, Bournemouth, an exhibition called 'A Century of Art' to celebrate 100 years of Bournemouth Art Club, along with work by the famous artists who inspired them, such as Henry Moore, Ben Nicholson, John Nash and Prunella Clough. People can choose to travel in their own cars or by coach. Please let us know your preferred transport so that we can book the right sized coach.

Once the weather gets warmer we can return to our outdoor painting days, and are hoping to be as lucky as we were this year. Workshops for next year

Hopefully it will be a much more certain year for our Workshop Programme in 2022. Hadspen Village Hall is open and we have in fact held a couple of workshops there since Lockdowns eased this year.

The first workshop of 2022 is in March with Anthony Connolly RP, 'Life drawing and Portraiture', which has been rescheduled from September. This is a much sought after course and it would be wise to book early.

We then have a mixture of workshops which cover a number of Fine Art disciplines, from Mixed Media Sculpture with Melanie Deegan to Semi-Abstract Landscape painting in Acrylics, basic Water-colour painting for beginners, Wax modelling and Pastels in the Summer with Katrina Wallis-King, who is a member of the Pastel Society and Figure drawing with James Budden, a well known local artist.

Nearer next Christmas we have a very exciting 'Botanical Painting - Winter Berries' workshop with Pauleen Trim who has just recently won a "Gold" at the "RHS Botanical Art and Photography Show 2021" in London, with the "Best in Show" award.

A Talk/Workshop, is a new idea which we are launching next year, which will be a day of looking at a particular group of European Painters from the early 20th Century and having fun emulating their style. We hope this will become a regular "History of Art" spot. The first one will be 'Paint like: les Fauves'.

I am sure we are all looking forward to a creative and positive 2022 and I hope to meet up with you then.

Collagraph Workshop with Jackie Curtis held on the 11th and 12th November

It was so good to have printer Jackie Curtis back again for a workshop in November at Hadspen Village Hall.

Jackie took us through two exciting days of "Collagraph" printing, which in her words is basically "a relief print, using a *collage* of materials".

We created printing blocks using a variety of different textures found in nature such as leaves, seeds and grasses as well as recycled materials, such as off cuts from the leather industry, netting, papers and card and, giving particularly satisfying results, aluminium sticky back foil.

We also used glue to "draw" on our blocks, which when dry makes amazing marks and patterns when put through the press.

Jackie as always, was totally organised, considering she had two printers to set up plus all the other printing materials.

As well as being a very competent and creative printer herself, Jackie brought a sense of excitement and wonder to those of us who took part, always patient, encouraging and positive. We went home tired out, but happy with our results.
